15 Prayer Prompts

Unity in Marriage

Scripture: “Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate.” — Mark 10:9

Prayer: Lord, knit our hearts together in oneness. Help us fight for unity, not against each other.

Financial Provision

Faith That Endures

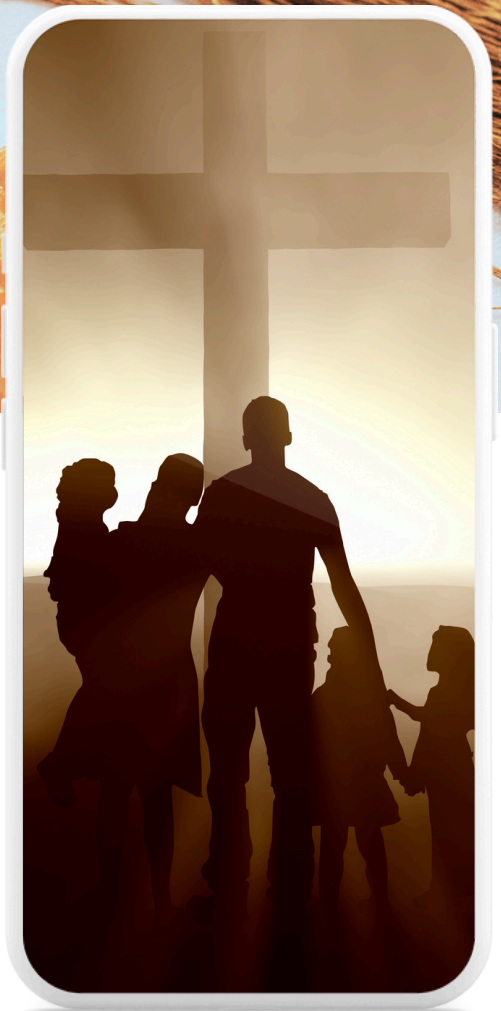
Scripture: “Let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus.” — Hebrews 12:1–2
